This week's program is Apple Ridge Farm – Send A Kid to Camp – presented by **John Lewis**, Executive Director. Academic Summer Camp is the flagship summer program from Apple Ridge Farm. The camp provides a daily mix of educational and outdoor activity to low-income children aged 6 to 16 years. Instruction focuses on reading, writing, STEAM, environmental education, computer programming, team building, and leadership skills. Outdoor activities include hiking, swimming, tennis, and organic agriculture. Beginning in 2017 the camp utilizes experiential learning techniques and also focuses on social emotional learning.

The camp provides postsecondary and career planning for kids and their parents. Campers learn about scholarship opportunities and visit colleges. At Family Day parents attend workshops to assist them with postsecondary and vocational planning for their children. Camp objectives are to close the achievement gap in low-income students, and provide physical activity, mentoring. And emotional learning. The camp is free tuition for low-income students and is supported through grants and private contributions.
