This week's program is **Service Leadership Programs (SLP)** – presented by **Reif Kessler**, SLP Advisor. Kiwanis Service Leadership Programs are leadership and character-building programs hosted in a school or community agency, sponsored by a Kiwanis club. Service Leadership Programs have existed since the first Key Club was founded in 1925.

Builders Club is the largest service organization for middle school students (ages 12 to 14), and is student led. Community-based Builders Clubs also may be established at community facilities such as churches and libraries. **Key Club International**, the largest high school service organization in the world, empowers its members to lead and serve by cultivating leadership skills, developing friendships, and performing community service. **Circle K International (CKI)** is the premier collegiate and university community service, leadership development, and friendship organization in the world. Circle K clubs are organized and sponsored by a Kiwanis club on a college or university campus. CKI is a self-governing organization and elects its own officers, conducts its own meetings, and determines its own service activities. CKI blends community service and leadership training with the opportunity to meet other college students around the world. **Aktion Club** is the only community-service club for adults living with disabilities. Aktion Club allows members to develop initiative and leadership skills in serving their communities while enabling their integration into society. Aktion Club originated in Florida in 1987 and was adopted as an official sponsored program of Kiwanis International in 2000.

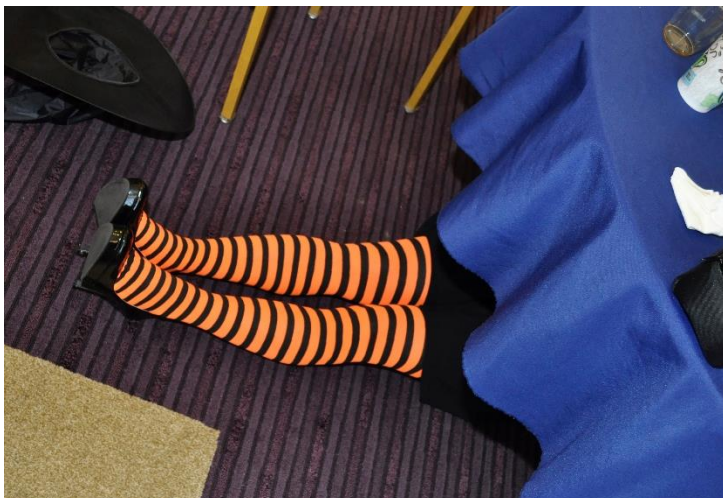
